Chichen Itza

Chichen Itza is a large Mayan city famous for a large, pyramid temple built by the ancient Mayan civilisation. It was built in approximately 400 AD which makes it over 1,500 years old. Chichen Itza is in the Yucatan Peninsula, a peninsula in North America.





El Castillo

El Castillo is the largest pyramid at Chichen Itza and is dedicated to Kukulkan, the Plumed Serpent. It is approximately Ikm in diameter. Archaeologists believe that it was once painted in bright colours although today, the remains of the temple are a pale grey, the colour of the original stone. Did you know that until recently tourists were table to climb the steps of the temple?



The Great Ball Court

The Great Ball Court measures 70 metres wide and 170 metres long. The captain of the team who lost the game would have their head chopped off as a form of sacrifice to the Mayan Gods. Some archaeologists also believe that the human heads were used as a ball in the games. Isn't that disgusting!



The Sacred Cenote

A cenote is a natural pool of water. This sacred cenote (otherwise known as the 'Well of Sacrifice') is one of the most well known cenotes in the world. Mayans believed that the rain God, Chaak, lived in caves and cenotes and those considered royalty would give gifts to him. This included sacrificing people and putting their bodies into the cenote. The cenote can be accessed via a corridor leading from the Great Plaza.
