

Maths

Maths will be taught at least three times a week. Pupils will develop their skills in number geometry and measure. They will be given the opportunity to apply their knowledge in real life situations.

Main Learning Intentions:

The activities will also link to the EHCP and IEP targets.

- To solve one-step problems that involve addition and subtraction, using concrete objects and pictorial representations, and missing number problems such as $7 = - 9$.
- To add and subtract numbers using concrete objects, pictorial representation and mentally
- To recognise and know the value of different denominations of coins
- To tell the time to the hour and half past the hour
- To identify and describe the properties of 2-D shapes, including the number of sides and line symmetry in a vertical line

Music

The pupils will be taught about pulse, rhythm and tempo. They will make rhythms based on Dinosaurs

Main Learning intentions

- To be able to combine pulse and rhythm.
- To know what the word rhythm mean
- To find the pulse or beat of music
- To be able to create a rhythmic pattern.

Art

Pupils will be given opportunities to produce creative topic based artwork with a focus on drawing and making sculptures this term. Pupils will be given the opportunity to explore a range of different medias and equipment and be encouraged to evaluate their work using creative language.

Main Learning Intentions

- To record their observations through drawing
- To use a range of materials creatively
- To create a dinosaur sculpture
- To use drawing to share imaginative ideas
- To look at artists work to develop own ideas

P.E.

Pupils will follow the Real PE scheme for PE. The focus for this term will be to develop Personal Skills through different Physical activities including swimming and yoga.

Main Learning Intentions:

- To follow rules within games
- To name things I am good at.
- To order instructions and skills.
- To explain why someone is working well
- To recognise similarities and differences in performances

English

The English writing will be based around News reports and dinosaurs will be used as a stimulus for writing their reports. Pupils will also be given the opportunity to write in poetry form as class this term alongside developing their Speaking and Listening, Reading and Writing skills.

Main Learning Intentions:

- To compose a sentence orally before writing it
- To write about real and fictional events
- To plan writing a report (by writing down ideas and/or key words, including new vocabulary)
- To write as a group in poetry form
- To use a capital letter for names of people, places and the days of the week

Speaking and listening skills will be throughout the curriculum and in specific lessons such as; communication groups, Circle Time activities and team building sessions.

Discrete Phonics lessons will be taught with a focus on CVC words along with Handwriting Lessons.

These will happen at least 3 times a week.

History

History lessons this term will focus on looking at the different pre-historic eras, dinosaurs and how cavemen and women lived.

Main Learning Intentions:

- To find out how hunter-gathers lived in Stone Age Britain
- To explore the style of cave art
- To examine non-written sources
- To understand what Stonehenge looks like
- To know that the bronze age was different to the stone age
- To describe some of the features of iron age art

RE

The pupils will learn about Signs and Symbols from Christianity Islam, Hinduism and Judaism.

Main Learning Intentions

- To understand how symbols and signs represent a meaning. To be able to talk about meanings contained in stories, objects and signs.
- To identify signs and symbols that are personally meaningful.
- To recognise that different religions have different signs and symbols.
- To identify signs and symbols that belong to specific religions.

Pre-Historic Era

Trips/Visitors

We will visit the Natural History Museum in Oxford.

British Values and SMSC

Pupils spiritual, moral, social and cultural (SMSC) development will be addressed through all areas of the curriculum. As part of this we will actively promote fundamental British values within this topic.

The government defines these as:

- Democracy
- The rule of law
- Individual liberty
- Mutual respect and tolerance of different faiths and beliefs

PSHCE

The focus of our PSHCE lessons will be 'Going for Goals'. The main focus will be around the importance of persevering and always trying to do our best. This will also be linked to class rules and making green choices.

Main Learning Intentions:

- To recognise and make responsible (green) choices
- To identify positive things about myself
- To understand and make a simple goal
- To recognise, name and deal with feelings in a positive way
- To recognise that our actions affect ourselves and others

Computing

Pupils will use the laptops and IPADs to research, record and produce fact files linked to the Dinosaur topic. There will also be lessons on E-Safety and keeping safe online when using search engines.

Main Learning Intentions:

- To use search engines to research a topic of interest.
- To begin to identify safe ways of using search technologies
- To save images/information found when researching.
- To insert media into publisher, word or PowerPoint
- To create a fact file using software publisher, word or PowerPoint

Cooking

The pupils will be given the opportunities to develop their cooking skills

Main Learning Intentions:

- The science of cooking- what happens to things when you apply heat or cold
- Recognizing kitchen equipment and learning how to use it
- Different tastes, textures and foods
- Reading and following recipes in order to create the final dish
- Dexterity, fine motor skills and coordination, carrying or pouring without spilling, opening containers and packets, weighing

Horticulture

Pupils have different opportunities to work in the horticulture area and get used to the environment. They will work on the different skills including familiarising the names of equipment and names of trees. This is a stand alone unit

Main Learning Intentions:

- Prepare equipment for planting spring flowers
- Name the tools and where they are kept
- Name different trees
- Plays/touches compost or soil
- Prepare seed tapes and mats

Science

The pupils will learn about skeletons in science and pupils will also explore fossils linking to this terms topic.

Main learning intentions

- To identify, name, draw and label the basic parts of the human body
- To using their observations and ideas to suggest answers to questions
- To recording findings using simple scientific language, drawings, labelled diagrams,
- To explore and compare the differences between things that are living, dead, and things that have never been alive
