

Personal Progress – Key Stage 4 and Key Stage 5 Qualification

Who Is It For?

This qualification pathway has been developed specifically for pupils working *towards* or *at Entry Level 1*, providing a structured way to have their achievements formally recognised within a qualification framework.

What It Involves

Pupils work through a selection of units from four key areas:

- Employability
- Independent Living
- Good Health
- Community Inclusion

There are 58 units available in total, each carrying between 2 and 5 credits. Schools can choose any combination of these units to suit individual learners, making the qualification highly flexible and personalised.

Depending on the number of credits a pupil completes, they can achieve one of the following qualifications:

- Award – 8 credits
- Certificate – 14 credits
- Extended Certificate – 25 credits
- Diploma – 37 credits

Pupils begin working towards this qualification when they join Senior School, and they continue building on their achievements into the Student Centre (Key Stage 5) for a further two years. This extended timeframe ensures every pupil has the opportunity to gain the highest number of credits possible.
